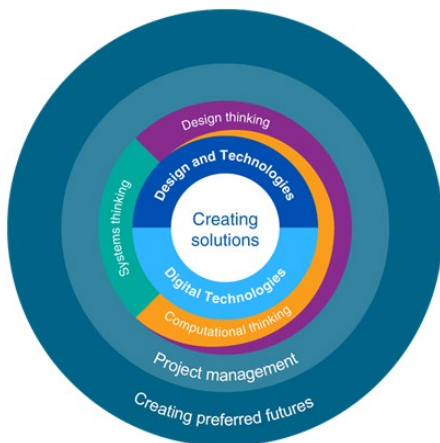


DIGITAL LITERACY
